Grabbing Florida's sunshine, passing it on to you

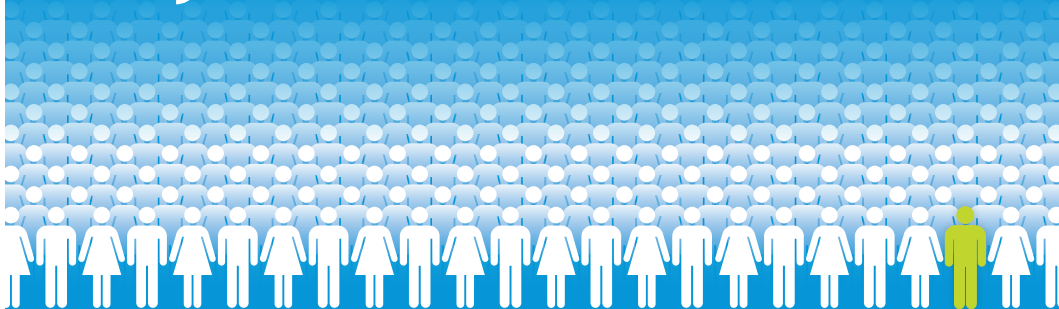

Storm charge adjustment

You will see a slight increase in the storm charge portion of your bill as part of a routine adjustment effective this month. This charge, which helps pay for previous hurricane restoration costs and builds the reserve for future storms, adjusts periodically during the year following Florida Public Service Commission review and approval. Beginning this month, the storm charge will be \$1.36 per 1,000 kWh. Learn more about your rates and charges:
