Storm charge adjustment

You will see a slight increase in the storm charge portion of your bill as part of a routine adjustment effective this month. This charge, which helps pay for previous hurricane restoration costs and builds the reserve for future storms, is adjusted periodically during the year following Florida Public Service Commission review and approval. The storm charge will be \$1.82 per 1,500 kWh for small, non-demand business customers. View all rate classes:
