


New tool helps businesses find ways to save



We offer a choice of meter

Smart meters provide important customer benefits, and that's why they're becoming the standard meter for FPL customers. However, eligible customers who prefer not to have the smart meter can choose to use a non-standard meter (the older technology replaced by the smart meter). Through a new tariff*, customers must pay an enrollment fee of \$95 and a monthly surcharge of \$13 to cover the cost of the non-standard service.
